Health and Safety planning day

The wider Health and Safety team attended a planning day recently, to share feedback and reflections on health and safety at ANZCO Foods in 2024 and to plan for 2025.

Managers and advisors from around the business provided feedback on things they were proud of which included the safety conversations rollout, receiving ISO 45001 certification; and focuses for next year. GM Operations Darryl Tones opened the day, and John Corcoran, James Blackstock, Erika Bergmans, and Donella Lloyd gave updates on their areas of the business.

The team's focus for next year is to continue to implement our new safety management systems, the next phase of safety conversations, and critical risk improvement including contractor and traffic management, the permit to work process, and emergency management.

What we've been doing...

Newsletters - We're changing how we approach Health and Safety Newsletters to make them more relevant to supervisors and workers, including this new 'What we've been doing' section.

Rep campaign - We'll be running a campaign to encourage more people to sign up as Health and Safety Reps in the new year.

SafetyNet - Through the ANZCO Crew app, anyone can log a safety conversation. These are sent to the Health and Safety team to load on to SafetyNet. We're working on a dashboard for supervisors to help them track trends amongst their employees.

Site visits - We're sharing information and learnings across our sites for a more unified approach. Beginning next year, we'll share best practice agenda items in weekly Advisor meetings, and supervisors will be invited to attend biweekly health and safety meetings.

Return to work processes/training - In the last few months, Managers, Supervisors, and Health and Safety Reps at Eltham, Canterbury and Kōkiri have received training to support injured employees' rehabilitation and return to work.

The purpose of the training was to recognise they have an important role to play in how injuries are perceived, and their responses positively or negatively impact how injury management is viewed by their wider team. The training was well received with plenty of engagement and discussion and will continue in the new year.
